At the confluence of North America and Europe, Montréal is an international destination of choice and the best island getaway in Canada. Easily accessible by land, water and air, the city centre is a mere 20 minutes from the Montréal-Trudeau International Airport.

The island features over 25,000 rooms, with 16,000 located downtown, and many connected directly to metro stations, shopping centres and the underground pedestrian network.



- Start your visit to Montréal by discovering the <u>downtown</u> core of the city, including the majestic Golden Square Mile and the always lively Quartier des spectacles.
- Daytime, nighttime, anytime,
  Montréal's safe and walkable downtown is one part sophistication and one part entertainment. For first-time visitors, here are some the most popular activities.
- **1.** See the city from the top of **Place Ville Marie**.
- 2. Go on a shopping spree along <u>Sainte-Catherine Street</u>, the longest commercial street in Canada.
- **3.** Sip cocktails on a patio on lively **Crescent Street** during F1 week.
- **4.** Visit the city's 33-km-long underground pedestrian network.
- 5. Celebrate the winter season with MONTRÉAL EN LUMIÈRE and la Nuit Blanche!

- Explore the shining beacon of central Montréal, the Golden Square Mile, home to glitz and glamour since the 19<sup>th</sup> century. You can find some of our most luxurious hotels and boutiques in this part of town.
- After, head to the <u>Quartier des</u> <u>spectacles</u> to end your evening with dinner and a live show!
- Night or day, sizzling summer heat or chilly wintry cold, the Quartier de spectacles welcomes all walks of life to its over 80 cultural venues and eight public spaces offering a diverse array of activities, including no less than 40 festivals, including the <u>Montreal</u> <u>International Jazz Festival</u> and <u>Just</u> <u>for Laughs</u>. In winter, don't miss the chance to skate on the brand-new refrigerated ice rink at the <u>Esplanade</u> <u>Tranquille</u>.





 Start your day with a <u>fresh croissant</u> or <u>French pastry</u> and <u>coffee</u> from one of the many sustainable and artisanal bakeries and coffee shops around town.



- Spend the day exploring the cobblestone streets of <u>Old Montréal</u> and take in the whirlwind of activities in the Old Port of Montréal.
- While Old Montréal's side streets and back lanes reveal their secrets over repeat visits, these charming gems of the old city are the city's pride and joy.
- 1. Marvel at the <u>Notre-Dame Basilica</u> and experience the multimedia show **AURA**.
- 2. Take a walk back in time through Place Jacques-Cartier and down Saint Paul Street.
- 3. Share the view of the St. Lawrence River with the angels of Ville-Marie atop the Notre-Dame-de-Bon-Secours Chapel.
- **4.** Play urban archaeologist and trace the fortifications from **Pointe-** <u>à-Callière</u>, Montréal Archaeology and History Complexe.
- Hungry? There are plenty of options in Old Montréal for lunch! You can people watch from a terrasse on Place Jacques-Cartier, take in the views from a roof top hotel or cruise the St. Lawrence while dining on local cuisine.



- After lunch, get ready for some adrenaline at the **Old Port of Montréal**.
- You can soar through the air with MTL Zipline, or conquer a pirate ship with Voiles en voiles, take a river cruise with AML and Bateau Mouche, ride the Lachine Rapids with les Sautes Moutons or surf on Saint-Lawrence River. If you are looking for a more relaxed afternoon, why not stroll along the boardwalk to discover some of the unique shopping kiosks, take in some rays from the Clock Tower Beach or maybe learn a little something at the Montreal Science Centre.



• If you feel like exploring further, rent a bike at <u>Ca Roule</u> bike shop or pick up a <u>BIXI</u> and pedal along the green shores of the <u>Lachine Canal</u> or head to <u>Parc Jean-Drapeau</u>. The city boasts a green environment with 1200 parks, 11 beaches, and 820 km of cycling paths.



- Nothing says winter in Montréal like strapping on a pair of blades and skating outdoors... and what wonderful place in the city to do just that than at the <u>Old</u> Port of Montréal ice skating rink!
- After all that exploring, why not reward yourself with a soothing spa treatment at <u>Bota-Bota, spa-sur-l'eau</u>, while taking in the relaxing views of the St. Lawrence River and Montréal skyline.



• End your amazing day high above the city with <u>La Grande Roue</u>, by watching the <u>L'International des Feux Loto-Québec</u> or by experiencing history with <u>Cité Mémoire</u>. In winter, make sure to experience the outdoor electronic music festival, <u>Igloofest!</u>





• Now is the time to dedicate your energy and curiosity to the many authentic and lively neighbourhoods and to live like a local! Montréal features 19 boroughs. First start your day with a Montréal tradition: **Brunch!** More than a meal, it's practically a religion.



 After all that food, you are going to want to burn it off! Jump on the metro and head to the <u>Plateau Mont-Royal</u> <u>and Mile-End</u> neighbourhoods.



• Far from the tourist crowds, this dynamic area offers authentic Montréal experiences, from shopping to dining to sightseeing to culture.

In winter, rent some <u>snowshoes, skis</u> <u>or skates</u> and explore Mount Royal Park.



• End your day with some fine dining along **Bernard Avenue** in the leafy neighbourhood of Outremont. Tucked away in the neighbourhood's warm, relaxing atmosphere, culinary treasures await discovery—from a gelato to copious fine dining with international accents— this avenue is one of the city's more inviting corners.





• Enjoy a leisurely breakfast at your hotel before heading out for a day full of culture and creativity! Montréal is the culture capital with over 50 museums!



• Do not miss any of the world-class exhibitions at the art and history museums, from post-impressionist painting at the Montreal Museum of Fine Arts and cutting-edge contemporary art at the MAC, to cinematic virtual reality experiences at the Phi Centre, and OASIS immersion, the largest immersive destination in Canada.



• Travelling with the family? Then head to <u>Space for Life</u>. Visit the penguins at the completely renovated <u>Biodôme</u>, wander the gardens of the <u>Botanical Garden</u>, check out some bugs at the Insectarium (temporarily closed) and take in the star-filled sky at the <u>Planetarium</u>.
